

Mug Cuff Pattern

Materials needed:

2 pieces of fabric measuring 5" x 10"

1 piece of batting measuring 5" x 10"

scrap piece of chalk board fabric measuring about 2 1/2" square

1 button

1 piece of elastic 4" long, or one pony tail band

Cutting:

Using pattern provided, trace pattern, use it to cut out two pieces of fabric and one piece of batting.

Assembly:

Place the two fabric pieces right sides together, lay the batting on top of these two pieces. Pin to secure layers together. Using a 1/4" seam allowance, sew around the two sides and one end, leaving the other end open and not stitched. Clip the corners and turn fabrics right side out. Press.

Take your scrap piece of chalk board fabric and center it in the middle of the cuff. Pin in place and zig zag stitch around the outer edge of the chalk board fabric to secure it to the cuff.

To close the open end of the cuff, and to secure the elastic in place: press under a 1/4" seam allowance. Pin elastic into the seam so that about 1 1/2" loop extends past the cuff. Zig zag stitch the elastic loop in place. Top stitch along the pressed edge to close the end of the cuff.

Mug Cuff closure: Find the right position for the button on the opposite end of the cuff from the elastic loop. When elastic loop is slipped over the button, it should hold the cuff secure on the mug. Sew the button into place.

Use chalk to write on the chalk board fabric and enjoy!
